Variables



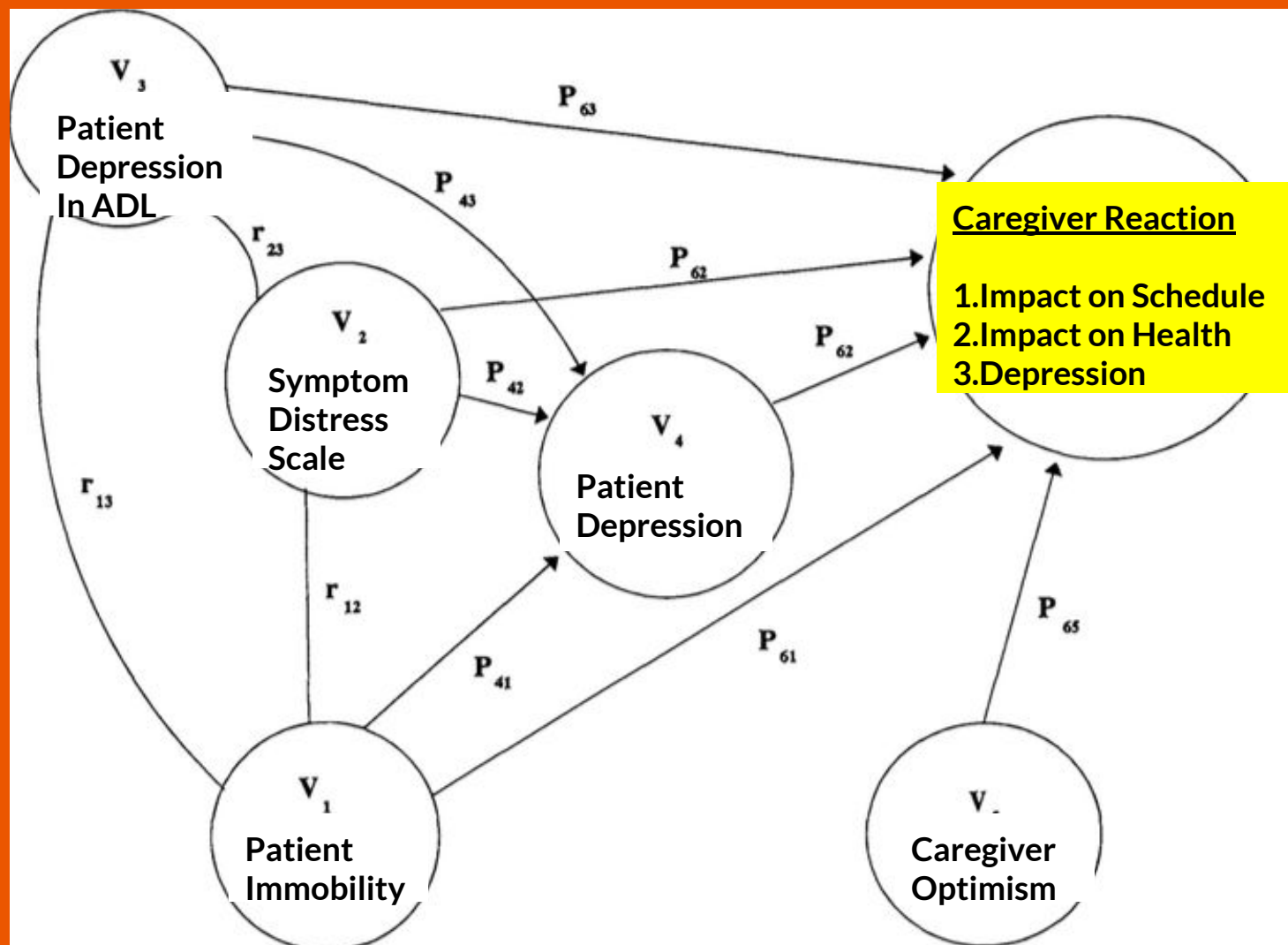
Patients

1. Symptom Distress Scale (experience with severe cancer-related symptoms)
2. Patient Depression (Symptomatology related depression)
3. Patient Depression in ADL (Activities of daily living)
4. Patient Immobility (how cancer interfere with mobility/ performance of physical tasks)

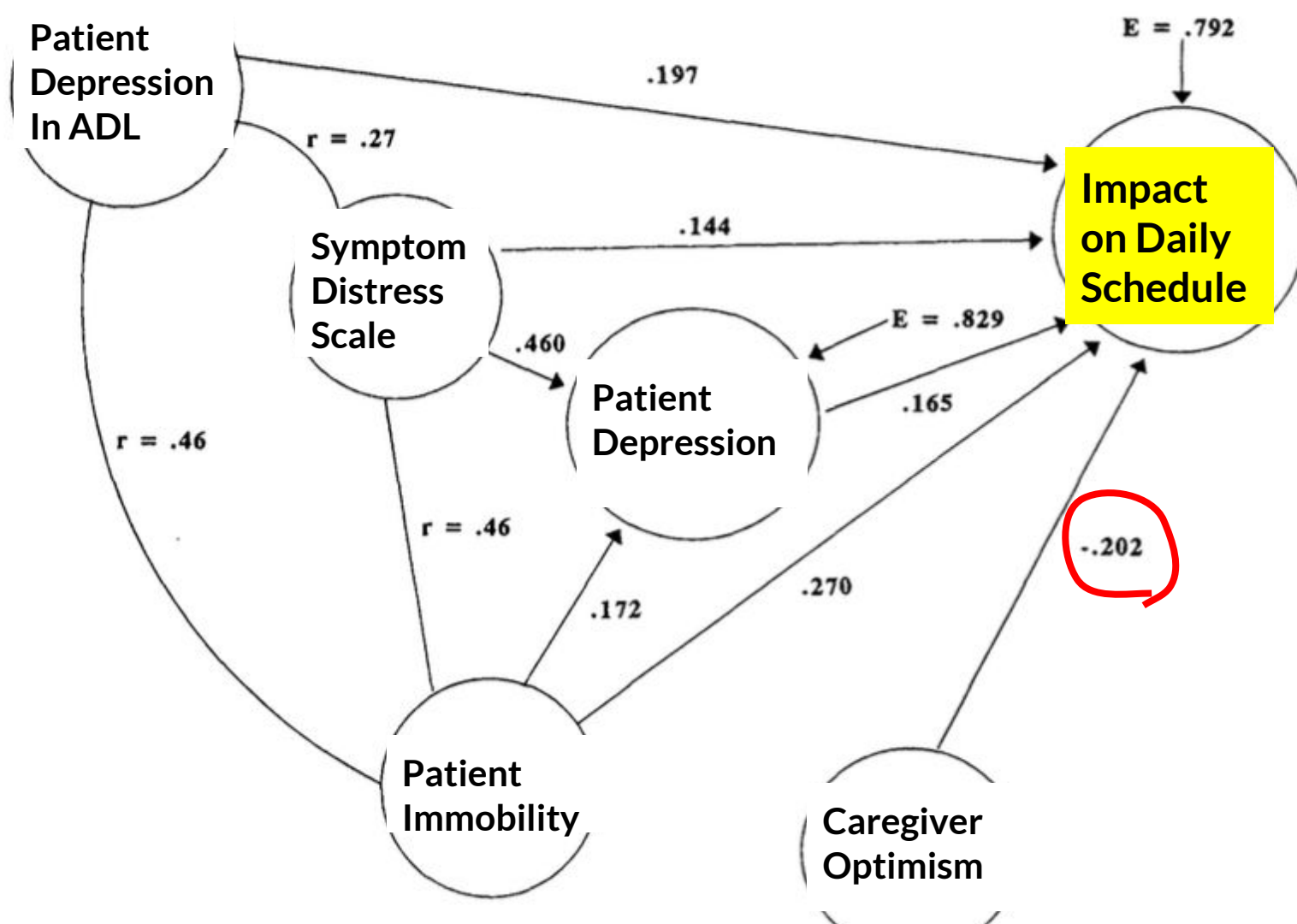
Caregivers

1. Caregiver Optimism
2. Caregivers' reaction --- ultimate response
 - a. Impact on schedule
 - b. Impact on health
 - c. depression

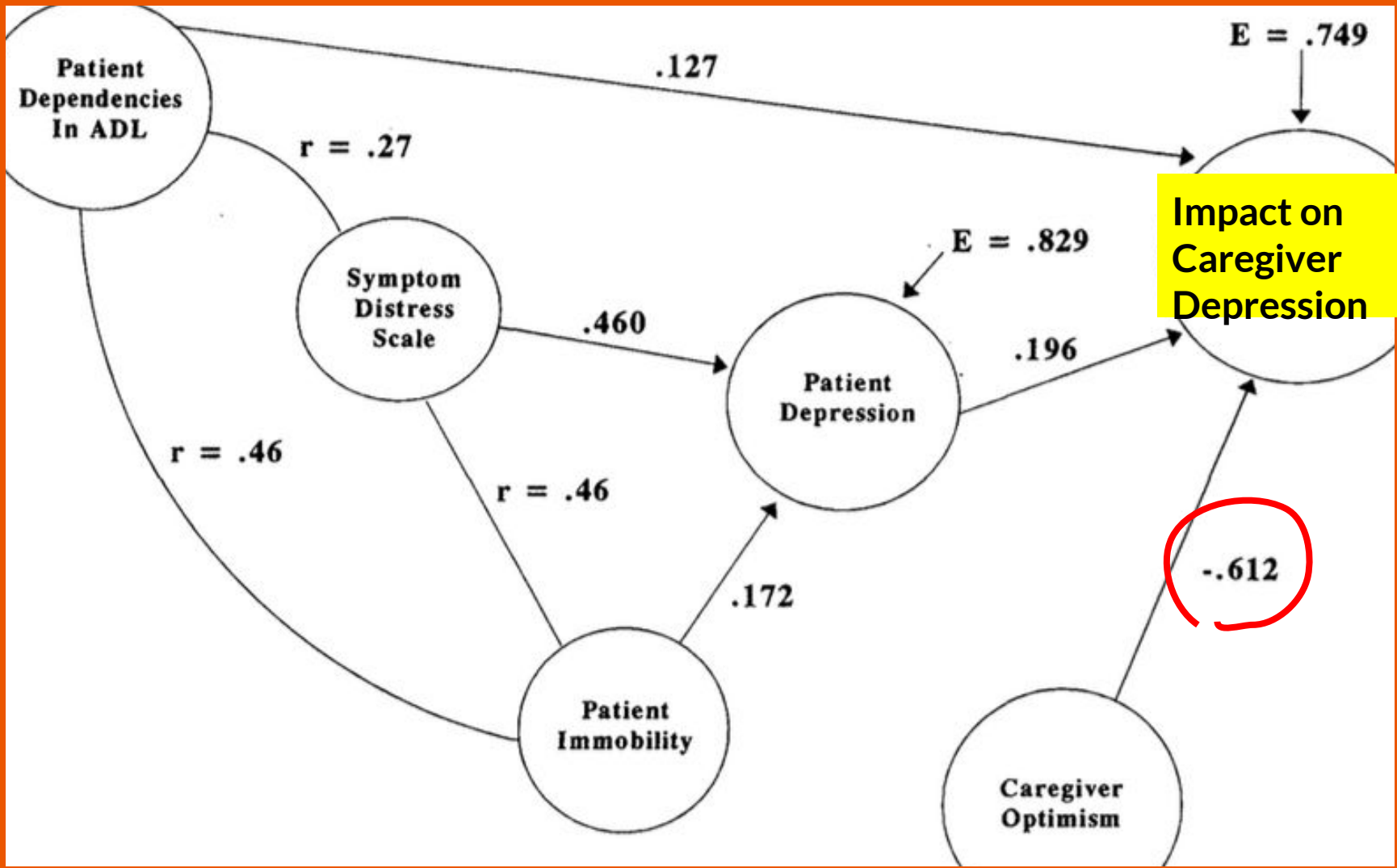
The Initial Path Model
